

Overview of student groups

- Erasmus students

These are students from universities (of applied sciences) with which Avans has concluded an exchange agreement within the framework of the European Union's Erasmus programme. These students will be studying at Avans as a guest for a maximum of one year (the exchange usually lasts 5 months), they do not pay any tuition fees for their time at Avans and they do not obtain a diploma from Avans.

- Exchange students (non-EEA)

These are students from universities (of applied sciences) with which Avans has concluded an exchange agreement. These students will be studying at Avans as a guest for a maximum of one year (the exchange usually lasts 5 months), they do not pay any tuition fees for their time at Avans and they do not obtain a diploma from Avans.

- Prep course students

These are students who have met the prior education requirements to study at Avans, but who do not yet have adequate English language skills. Avans offers a so-called 'preparatory course' for this purpose. Students pay a set course fee. Students who receive a certificate can then progress to the bachelor's degree programme of their choice.

- Minor students

These students come to Avans (usually for half a year) to take a minor. Students pay a set course fee. They do not obtain a diploma from Avans.

- Master's students

All students who come to Avans to study with the intention of obtaining a master's diploma and who pay the statutory tuition fees or the tuition fees of the institute (of higher education). A bachelor's degree in one or more specific disciplines is required to access all master's programmes, in some cases in combination with other requirements.

- Bachelor's students

All students who come to Avans to study with the intention of obtaining a bachelor's diploma and who pay the statutory tuition fees or the tuition fees of the institute (of higher education).

- Bachelor's students (double degree contracts with other universities)

These are students from institutes with which Avans has a so-called 'degree' or 'double degree' agreement. These institutes are:
